Welcome to the Open House 2017-2018 Annual Report

Often the acknowledgements in annual reports are left to the end credits, but I would like to start this year's report by acknowledging the contribution of our staff (and their supportive families), our CEO Paul (and partner Theresa) and the many volunteers, including the Board and their partners, who make Open House truly a place where people feel they belong.

In a world that increasingly disconnects relationships, the work of Open House continues to fill the gap and reconnects people in our community with a spirit of acceptance and belonging. The Christian basis for Open House is the expression of love and caring for others in need. The great paradox is that when we live true to this friendship ministry we are in turn blessed with a sense of meaning and purpose that surpasses worldly understanding.

We have much to be thankful for; the work of Open House has been blessed by volunteers with a variety of gifts including those who give diligently to provide the financial base for our work. Over the next few years as we see the decline in block funding and the further introduction of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), the generous giving of our financial supporters will enable us to continue caring for people in a holistic manner regardless of their entitlement (or not) to NDIS funding.

In closing I want to acknowledge the significant work over the past few years in ensuring Open House has a strong underpinning of policies and procedures as well as robust risk management and Human Resource frameworks to support our charity status and government accreditation. While these aspects should never be the focus of our work, they provide a solid foundation for our operation and assist with good standards in service delivery.

In the year ahead, the staff and board will be reviewing our strategic plan to ensure we continue to be focused and diligent in our work. While our mission as an expression of God's love and caring remains constant, finding new and better ways to express this mission is responsible governance and stewardship.

Thank you for your continuing support and contribution to Open House.

For my husband and I we are so excited for her to have something to look forward to and somewhere for her to go where we know she will be safe and looked after.

A big thank you to all your amazing staff and volunteers but the person we most want to acknowledge and thank is your amazing Youth Worker, Melanie. She is such an amazing role model for her and we are so grateful to her for taking her under her wing. Thanks to Melanie, our daughter for the first time in her whole life feels wanted, needed and valued. When I first met Melanie she was keen to know how she could help and I shared with her how lonely my daughter was and how much she craved to be included and wanted.

For us we desperately wanted to have something in her life for her to look forward to. I told her that at school her experiences are not so good, that no one looks for her and it is the same on the weekends and school holidays.

We continue to have some great cook ups at Open House including home made pizza (on the outdoor table the participants made) and the traditional South African Potjie around the fire to farewell Bethel, one of our friendly volunteers.



The Joey & Bat Sanctuary (JABS) in West Heidelberg were so grateful for the hard work the participants had put into designing, building, constructing and decorating fifteen new bat boxes as part of some community work within the program.



The participants really enjoyed laying the instant turf at Open House as part of the work experience component of the program. They all got stuck into it (literally) as it was very wet and muddy, but they put their minds to it and managed to lay it all in a few days and are now able to enjoy the benefits of lush green grass outside!



Looking forwards, we are excited about the upcoming Plug In Program which is set to take place in the second half of 2018. We are expecting to have eighteen new participants join us and to grow in their friendships, confidence and skills as well as experience some amazing opportunities and meet some of our amazing program partners including HealthAbility and Headspace Greensborough.





Our revenue comes from multiple sources. The bulk of our expenses are the salaries and related costs of our team providing programs and services





