Open House is about the people not the programs. We are about offering the hand of friendship to anyone who is lonely and socially isolated and or are just looking for a place to belong.

Don't get me wrong we are not against programs and we provide programs for people of all ages, backgrounds and religions. However, the programs are not the focus of our work they are simply the tools that help us to achieve our purpose.

The Friendship we offer is about the individual needs of the person. We embark on a life long journey with people if they so desire, which means being there for people no matter what.

People often ask who do we work with? Our answer is simple; everyone and anyone.

Yes, **we are a Christian organisation** but we are not affiliated to a single denomination and we warmly welcome everyone to a place they can belong and call home.

We have noticed during this year that the need for our work is greater than ever. The Tuesday meal is now feeding more people than it has before and for the first time ever the Youth Workshop Mentoring Program has a waiting list. The local schools have seen the value of the work we do and the difference it is making to those that have attended the program. As a result they are wanting more of their young people to attend. What is also worth noting is that there have also been requests for us to take our work in to the schools!

In the next 12 months, we have a dream to expand our services we offer to more and more people, all we need is the right partnerships because everyone deserves **a place to belong**.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

Reflecting on the 2018 to 2019 financial year, I am greatly aware of how much has been achieved in such a short time. Most of all I am impressed by the continuing growth of our staff, volunteers and participants.

The unique work of Open House is embedded in the local Banyule community and reflects an ethos of unconditional acceptance and inclusion. Our provision of a 'Place to Belong' is an expression of God's love in a world where many feel lonely, unloved and unworthy. This vision and mission is well integrated in the daily activities of the organisation and as I recently wandered around some of the activities it was exciting to see the expression of this mission in the building of relationships and the sharing of life and friendship.

We have much to be thankful for.

While the past few years have been a period of change and growth and we can expect more of the same in the years ahead, Open House continues to operate on a solid foundation in financial terms and operationally due to its committed staff / volunteers, infrastructure and facilities. This in turn provides confidence for the future and the capacity to seek new ways of expressing the Open House mission. My hope for the year ahead is that we might consider new ways to help participants repair broken relationships and experience stronger family connections.

In last year's annual report I flagged the Board's concern regarding the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and the potential negative impact this might have on our funding. While we have had some reprieve on the proposed changes by funding bodies, we are still concerned about the capacity of the NDIS to properly support people with disabilities and in particular people struggling with mental health issues. We will need to monitor this carefully as the Australian Senate begins their enquiry of the implementation and capacity of the NDIS.

As mentioned - we have much to give thanks for, in particular I am mindful that our positive foundation is due to God's rich provision through people who have faithfully given over many years and in some cases decades. Thank you for your financial and prayer support for the work of Open House.

I acknowledge and thank our Open House Board members (past and present) for their contribution and sound stewardship. A special thank you to Open House staff, volunteers and their families for their many hours of committed service. Last, but not least, thanks to our CEO Paul Burgess and his wife Theresa for solid leadership and commitment as we work together to realise the Open House Mission.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

BOYS 2 MEN

The participants meet every Wednesday afternoon and spend time with positive male role models getting up to all sorts of fun like building projects in the workshop, making a mess outside or playing sports in the hall. This financial year was a special one as we saw a few participants "graduate" as they have reached the end of primary school. Many of the boys have been coming for many years so now they get a chance to return as trainee team members in the program.

FRIDAY DROP-IN

The drop in continues to be a relaxed space for young people in the area, especially for those seeking an intense game of dodgeball or a chance to chat over some chips.

Each term there are theme nights which encourage participants to come out of their comfort zone or test their skills in a sport or "minute to win in it" challenge!

Trivia night seemed to be a winner, where we got to see participant's sing and show off their movie knowledge.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM

Every school holiday we get geared up for a mix of fun outings and on-site activities in our primary-aged school holiday program. Catering for smaller groups, last year we ran popular outings to laser tag and the park. As always, the flying fox got a real workout when the Open House participants visited Ruffey Lake Park in Doncaster. Other exciting outings included a visit to Science Works, Melbourne Zoo and a photo scavenger/treasure hunt which required the participants to find buried treasure!

Real friendships are formed which makes this program worthwhile for those involved.

FUN CLUB

Fun Club has seen some new participants come in, widening the age range for the group. As the dynamics changed we have seen our group working in harmony with one another!

A recent highlight was a skipping competition, one where the whole team had to work together to achieve a set number of goals for how many jumps they could do. One girl in particular was really scared to give skipping a go however by the end loved having given it a go, after much encouragement! She was so proud of herself, beaming from ear to ear!



YOUTH WORKSHOP MENTORING PROGRAM

What a year it's been in the **YWMP**! I'm pleased to report that there have been many successes and breakthroughs in our participants lives over the course of this year.

This program continues to be a healthy and vital part of the work we do at Open House. New friendships formed, skills learnt, community connections and re-engagement with schools and jobs are all part of the outcomes of the program and many participants have experienced and thrived in these areas.

With the expert advice from Brian (one of our long-term volunteers in the YWMP) and Kamal (Youth Support Worker) we embarked on a new adventure with the acquisition of a bee colony. We were blessed to receive a generous donation of bee suits and equipment from a local bee shop in Eltham, after we talked and shared about the work we were involved in with young people in the community. With the bees onsite and lots of interested participants eager to take a peek inside, we proceeded to investigate the bees progress after the big move. Many participants have become fascinated with the bee's and the process of caring for them.

We are yet to produce our first batch of honey, but we are all waiting expectantly for that exciting day!

Participants have continued to enjoy learning new skills in the workshop whilst building possum boxes, bat boxes and joey frames for the Joey & Bat Sanctuary in West Heidelberg. They have also worked hard making chopping boards as part of our social enterprise, raising funds to support the work of Open House. There have been plenty of cooking experiences making pasta, pizza and potjie and some amazing outings to Blue Lakes, Lake Mountain, the Holocaust Museum, BMX tracks and Kinglake.

PLUG IN

The Plug In program (funded by School Focused Youth Services) was successfully delivered in 2018 over twenty weeks with 20 young people participating in this exciting, adventure filled program. Open House partnered with Headspace Greensborough and healthAbility to offer a diverse, rounded program. The focus was to improve the engagement of students at school by giving them the opportunity to be part of a program based on building self-awareness, self-confidence and self-esteem. There was also a focus on improving social skills and relationships, providing hands on learning opportunities, restoring enjoyment to learning, linking young people with appropriate support, providing mentoring, supporting family relationships and establishing goals and a re-engagement plan.

With a mix of onsite and offsite components, the participants were exposed to a wide variety of adventures, opportunities and activities.

Onsite, the focus was on building a perimeter fence around Open House and building a roof over the coffee cart storage area. Some of the offsite activities included an amazing trip up to Lake Mountain for some tobogganing (best snow fall we have seen in years), tree surfing in the mountains, BBQ's at Blue Lakes, bike rides and plenty more.

The participants were taught the importance of giving back to the community by engaging in community work. We assisted in some garden maintenance for five families in the area. The participants really enjoyed being able to help others out and give back to their community.

One of the highlights was the Plug In Camp to Upper Plenty Conference Centre where we enjoyed amazing food, log cabins, hikes, archery, capture the flag, quality conversations around campfires and strengthening of friendships. The participants ranked this activity the highest of all and absolutely loved spending some time in nature with their peers.

Family are such an important part of our lives and so it was important for us to invest in families all together. Throughout the program we organised Family Engagement Activities which essentially brought together all the families for some good food, fun, games and to create some positive memories.

As the saying goes, all good things must come to an end, however, **Open House has always focused on the long-term aspect of friendship** and we have managed to keep a number of Plug In participants engaged in the Youth Workshop Mentoring Program to this day!



MALAHANG RESERVE PROGRAMS

It has been a great year at Malahang Reserve where the Open House presence continues to grow and be known by the local community.

Currently we run the **Bike Hut**, **Backyard Sports (BYS)** program and the **Coffee Cart** on Thursday afternoon's which creates a buzz.

Backyard Sports mostly kept close to the action, playing basketball and soccer on the court near the Bike Hut.

A five week program lead by the AFL and supported by BYS saw new faces come and try football, some for the first time.

The Malahang Reserve Programs are a vital part of the work of Open House as we go out into the community to meet people where they are at and form many strong connections with the community,

Over the last twelve months the Bike Hut has recycled and repaired over 500 bikes, and given away over 100 Bikes to the local community.

The group help to maintain the garden, with watering, weeding, mowing and planting.

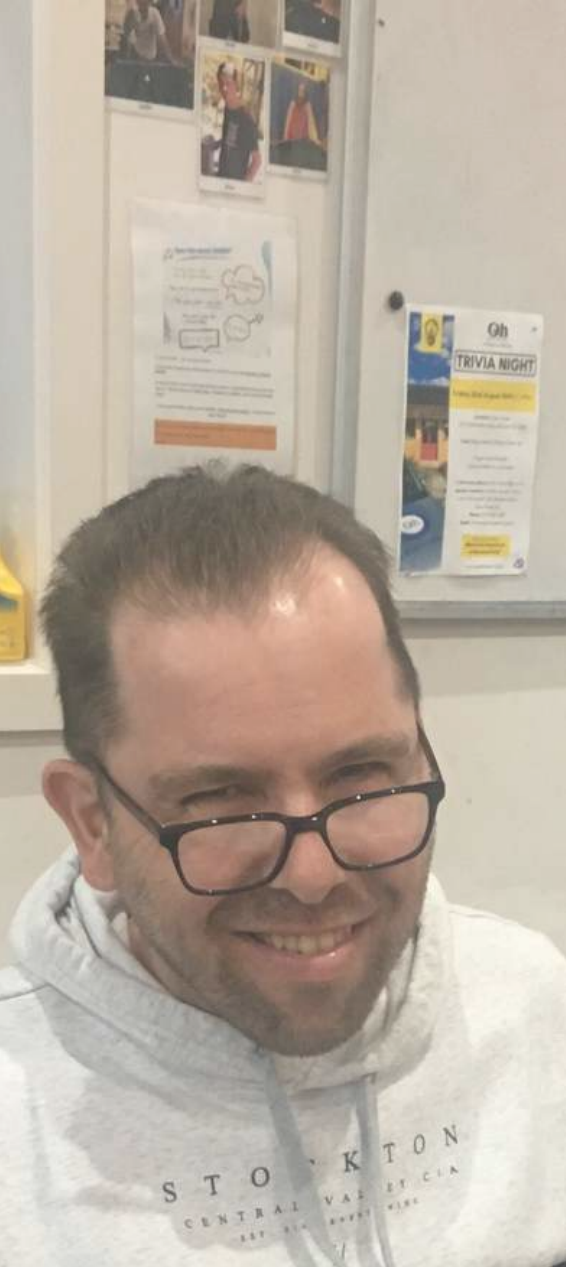

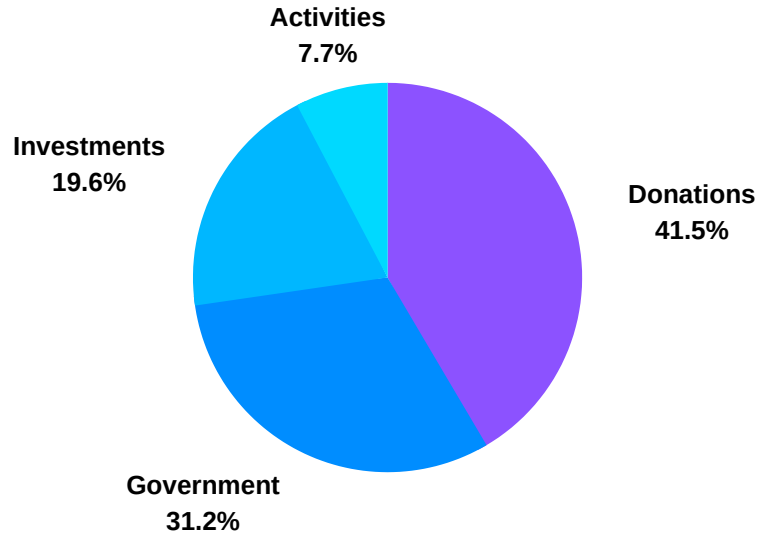

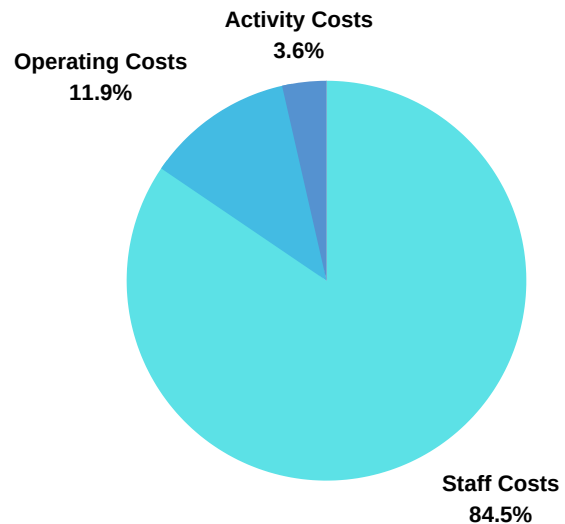
FINANCIALS

Operating Expenses



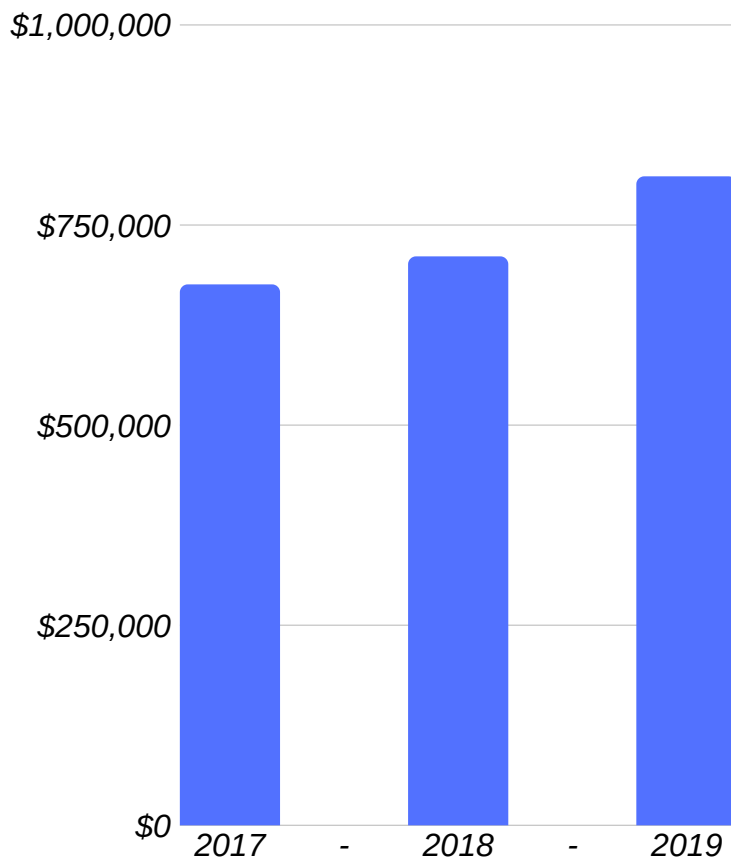
In-Kind Volunteer Contributions

Volunteers are the life blood of Open House, and it is worth noting that Open House currently has over **60 volunteers**, who volunteer the same amount per year as

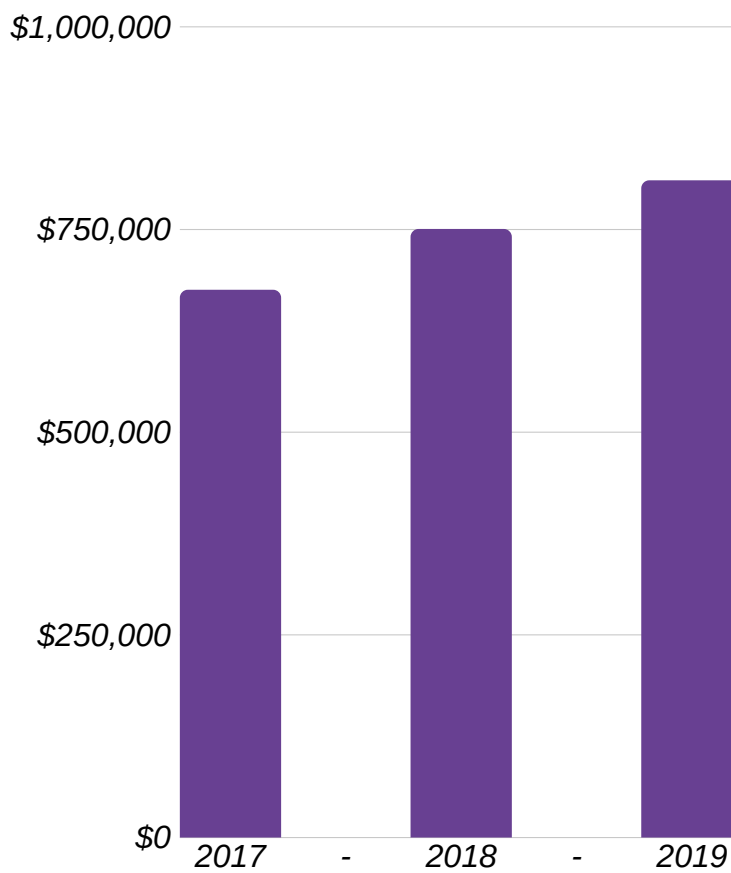
